Why did we create these data tables?

Meets Reporting Requirement

Each year City College of San Francisco analyzes disaggregated student data to review opportunity gaps, assess progress, and plan for improvement. The data are disaggregated by the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) identified groups.

Provides the College with Equity Data

These data tables are used by the Office of Student Equity, the Student Equity Strategies Committee (an Academic Senate Committee), and the college to inform decision-making. These data are updated each year.

What is an opportunity gap?

An opportunity gap occurs when a subset of students based on student characteristic such as race/ethnicity, gender and other demographics are unjustifiably experiencing lower outcomes compared to the student population.

How do we measure an opportunity gap?

PPG method:

subpopulation outcome % - total college outcome %

Successful Enrollment/Access	Are first time CCCApply applicants from 2020-21 enrolling into at least one course at CCSF?	Are we reaching the populations in our service area (San Francisco city/county)?
Persistence	Do first time students enrolled in the 2020- 21 AY enroll in the subsequent primary term?	Do students enrolled in Fall 2020 semester then enroll in the Spring 2021 semester?
Completed Both Transfer-Level Math and English	Do 2020-21 first time students complete both transfer level math and English within 1 year of their first semester at CCSF?	Do 2020-21 first math or English students complete math or English within 1 year of starting math or English?



When looking at the overall population as on the previous slide, white students have gaps in access and retention, but those gaps go away when prior education of students and potential students in San Francisco is taken into consideration.


Percent of students with BA or higher







Completion of transfer-level English in 1 year






Pass transfer level English after 1 year

—College Average: Pass transfer level after 1 year (56.7%)


Completion of transfer-level English in 1 year

Completed Transfer level English after 1 year Fall 2020 cohort




Completion of transfer-level Math in 1 year

Completed Transfer level math after 1 year Fall 2020 cohort




Completion of transfer-level Math in 1 year

Completed Transfer level math after 1 year Fall 2020 cohort




Graduation

Graduated (earned a degree or cert.) 2017-18 cohort within 3 years





Graduated (earned a degree or cert.) 2017-18 cohort within 3 years




Transferred to a 4 year 2016-17 cohort within 3 years



Noncredit and Equity data

Noncredit data during the pandemic years is not available. As new noncredit data becomes available CCSF will incorporate it into the noncredit data used for planning.

AEP equity goals:

CCSF will continue working in alignment with its Student Equity and Achievement Plan, and will implement Chancellor Oakley's call to action. CCSF will continue to address systemic racism through five focus areas:

- 1. Student-centered we put students' needs first;
- 2. Fearless we persist through challenges;
- 3. United we celebrate and build on each other's strengths;
- 4. Social justice we stand with those most vulnerable in our community; and
- 5. Diversity driven we respect and seek to understand each person.

Goal:

Close the opportunity gap over the next 3 years for the populations with the largest disproportionate impact within each metric.

To close the gap we need more students within the focus population to meet the metric.
