The Chancellor shall establish the administrative procedures for imposing and enforcing Student Discipline when a student violates the Code of Student Conduct in accordance with the requirements for due process of the federal and state law and regulations. No student shall be removed, suspended or expelled unless the conduct for which the student is disciplined is related to college activity or college attendance, except for sexual assault or sexual exploitation as provided in Education Code Section 76033(g) and 76033 (h). The District presumes that the student respondent is not responsible for any alleged sex-based discrimination or sex-based harassment until a determination is made at the conclusion of its grievance procedures.

However, nothing in this policy or the associated administrative procedure should be interpreted to subject a student to a disciplinary sanction solely on the basis of conduct that is speech or other communication that, when engaged in outside the campus, is protected from governmental restriction by the First Amendment to the United States Constitution or Section 2 of Article I of the California Constitution.

The Code of Student Conduct Administrative Procedure shall describe the conduct that constitutes good cause for student discipline.
