29.G. Distance Education

- Distance Education is defined by the Code of Federal Regulations (34 CFR 600.2) and by the California Code of Regulations, Title 5, Section 55200. as instruction, education, or trainingwhere the instructor and the student are separated geographically, <u>taught</u> Communication between the student and instructor is made through <u>the College's Learning Management</u> <u>System (LMS)</u>, through one or more technological devices such as live or recorded visual presentations and materials using direct signal or cable, transmission by telephone line,fiber-optic line, video tape, CD-ROM, computer or internet technology, or email. "Course" as used in this Article refers to any class offered by the District.
- Training and compensation, including extra pay or release time for work performed by faculty members who develop Distance Education courses, shall be negotiated by the Union and the District. In each case in which the faculty member develops a Distance Education course, an agreement regarding this compensation and the work to be performed will be executed by the faculty member, the District and AFT (see Exhibit N).
 - 2.1. In order to teach a distance education course, faculty must participate in complete initial online training as provided by the Office of Online Learning and Educational Technology (i.e., Introduction to Online Teaching and Learning, IOTL). Faculty shall receive 1 workload unit of compensation for successfully completing this training. Faculty must complete the training within an academic year. Faculty may receive additional compensation for the development of a new course for distance education, per 29.G.2.3.

Alternatively, faculty may participate in equivalent training outside of CCSF as defined by the Distance Learning Advisory Committee (DLAC) and approved by the Academic Senate. Training outside of CCSF, if approved by DLAC, will qualify faculty to teach distance education courses at CCSF but faculty will not receive <u>CCSF load or pay</u> compensation for such training. Such faculty may elect to participate in initial online training as provided by the Office of Online Learning and Educational Technology but will not be eligible for compensation for this training.

2.2. <u>An individual Faculty</u> developing a course for distance education that they have has not been previously developed shall receive compensation based on the number of courses the faculty member has developed and the normal teaching workload for the class, as follows:

<u>Workload</u> units of the course to be developed	2 or more workload units	Less than 2 workload units
First course	Two (2) workload units	One (1) workload unit

Second course	Two (2) workload units	One (1) workload unit
Third course	Two (2) workload units	One (1) workload unit
Subsequent courses	No workload	No workload

In each case in which the faculty member develops receives compensation fordeveloping a Distance Education course, an agreement regarding this compensation and the work to be performed will be executed by the faculty member, the District and AFT (see Exhibit N). Faculty receiving compensation must complete online course development milestones as defined by the by the Office of Online Learning and Educational Technology.

2.3. If the District implements For mandated refresher training, if and when the college implements such a requirement for online distance education instructors, faculty shall be compensated at their non-instructional rate based on the length of the training.

For a 3-unit load, The equivalent of 7 non-instructional hours of work per week during semester, or as follows: 3 workload units of release time for full-time teachers, OR 122.5 non-instructional hours at my salary scale.(3 workload units) When a faculty member participates in initial online required training and/or course development, an agreement regarding this compensation and the work to be performed will be executed by the faculty member, the District and AFT (see Exhibit N).

For course development of second and third online classes subsequent to IOTL training, or forfirst and second classes if CCSF IOTL training was not required: Faculty shall receive a stipend equal to two workload units at the non-instructional rate (81.5 non-instructional hours).

This stipend shall only be granted for development of classes that the individual faculty member is assigned toteach online for the first time.
 This stipend shall only be granted to any individual faculty member two times during their employment at CCSF.
 This stipend shall be paid on the first pay period in whichthe class is scheduled

- 3. The faculty member retains ownership of and the right to copyright course materials of Distance Education courses, except for ownership of the courseware shell.
- 4. <u>The District shall provide access to initial online training to:</u>

 <u>- All faculty who teach in departments where distance education is used, and</u>
 <u>- All faculty who teach in departments where distance education will be used within the following two years.</u>

4. Right of First Refusal

4.1 The faculty member who creates a distance education course, whether a new distance

education course or an existing course converted to a distance education course, shall maintain the right of first refusal to teach the course for four (4) semesters, provided that (a) there is adequate enrollment to offer the course, and (b) the faculty memberremains in good standing, as defined above. Faculty members meeting these conditions are referred to as "such originating faculty members."

- <u>4.1.1. If such originating faculty members decide not to continue to teach the course,</u> <u>the terms of G.4.2 apply.</u>
- <u>4.1.2 If the District wishes to reassign the course and provide</u> the course materials of such originating faculty members to another faculty member over the originating faculty members' objection, the District shall consult with the originating faculty members and Union before determining a final course of action, with review by the Chancellor in the event of continued disagreement. The District, Union and originating faculty members shall agree, prior to reassignment of the course, to the amount to be paid the originating faculty member for a license fee and shall also agree to the duration of the license.</u>
- <u>4.1.3 If the faculty member does not remain in good standing with adequate</u> <u>enrollment for the entire four semesters, the terms of G.4.2 apply.</u>
- <u>4.2 After the initial period defined in G.4.1, the District shall retain a non- exclusive, non-</u> <u>transferable license to use such course for internal instructional, educational and-</u> <u>administrative purposes</u> <u>compensation for a period of four (4) semesters additional to</u> <u>any semesters in which the course was already taught by the</u> <u>originating faculty</u> <u>member. This license shall not include the right</u> <u>to create derivative works absent the</u> <u>written consent of the originating faculty member.</u>
- Faculty teaching a distance education course must first complete District sponsored training (or the equivalent as defined by Distance Learning Advisory Committee (DLAC). and agree to follow the guidelines and requirements of the Office of Online Learning and Educational Technology.

5. If the district seeks to assign one or more other faculty member(s) one or more additional section(s) of an online course using the materials from an online course currently taught by a unit member:

- 5. 1 The decision shall be subject to agreement with the Union and originating faculty member;
- 5.2 The load factor for the additional section(s) shall be the same as provided for the original section; and

5.3 The parties will reach a written agreement over an appropriate license fee and duration of use.

- <u>46</u>. Distance education course curriculum shall be developed pursuant to established curriculum policies and procedures.
- 57. Teaching of distance education courses shall be on a voluntary basis.
- <u>68</u>. The decision of whether and when to offer distance education courses shall remain the exclusive prerogative of the District, except as limited by the specific terms of this Section G. Assignment and scheduling of faculty who volunteer for such courses shall be in accordance with Article 13 and 13-1 of this Agreement and this Section G.
- If the creating faculty member is not going to continue teaching a distance education course, the assignment decision in respect to volunteers shall be made in accordance with Article <u>13.</u>
- 10. Faculty selected to teach a distance education course must participate in District-sponsored training as required and agree to follow the guidelines and requirements of the Office of Technology-Mediated Instruction.
- 741. Distance education sections of a course shall have a class capacity set in accordance with Article 18. no higher than the modal capacity of the in-person sections of the course during the previous three academic years that were not limited by room capacity constraints. If the course has not been offered in person during the previous three academic years, then the class capacity will be no higher than the modal class capacity of similar courses offered in person by the department during the previous three academic years, as defined by the department chair. Existing class size limits for conventional courses shall apply to their online versions. Telecourse limits are as set forth in Article 18.E.
- 810. The District shall provide, if needed, a computer for use in developing and delivering the online courses. Any such computer shall remain property of the District.
- 9<u>11</u>. The District may provide for summer training opportunities; however, no faculty will be mandated to attend training outside of the academic calendar.
