IV. Officers' Reports

President Saginor reported that:

- She would be attending an Accreditation training cosponsored by Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC) and the Academic Senate for the California Community Colleges (ASCCC), February 8–9, 2013.
- The case brought by California Competes against the State Chancellor's office over 10 + 1 matters had received a response from State Chancellor Harris affirming the legality and functional appropriateness of title 5 sections 53200 and 53203.

VI. Old Business

A. Learning Outcomes:

Resolution 2013.2.6.01 Institutional Learning Outcomes

Whereas, the Academic Senate has engaged in extensive dialogue concerning learning outcomes to epitomize goals for student learning at City College of San Francisco; And,

Whereas, the Academic Senate has identified the following goals for Institutional Learning Outcomes:

• ILOs are achieved by students who meet their own educational goals at City College. The

student's goals do NOT have to be satisfying degree requirements, transferring, or earning a certificate. A student whose educational goal is acquisition of basic English for the work environment or updated job skills should achieve all ILOs in the process of reaching their own goals.

- ILOs represent very broad modes of learning that can be experienced through many paths. For instance, the ability to communicate is achieved through writing, speaking, music, dancing, and / or visual art. Our communication ILO can be satisfied through any one of these modes or any combination of them.
- ILOs should be few in number and general in application.
- ILOs are expected to be continually reviewed and refined to improve their usefulness and assessment.

Whereas, the Student Learning Outcomes Coordinator has provided substantial contributions to improving and refining initial draft ILOs proposed in November, 2012; Therefore, be it

Resolved, that the Academic Senate recommend the following Institutional Learning Outcomes for adoption by the College:

- I. Critical Thinking and Information Competency
 - Use reason and creativity to make decisions and solve problems
 - · Apply diverse viewpoints to aid in decision making or problem solving
 - Locate, retrieve, and evaluate information using appropriate research strategies, tools, and technology.

II. Communication

- Communicate effectively
- Demonstrate respectful interpersonal and intercultural communication
- Recognize and interpret creative expression

III. Cultural, Social, and Environmental Awareness

- Demonstrate an understanding of the history and values of other people and cultures
- Demonstrate an understanding of civic, social, and environmental responsibility
- Demonstrate civic, social, and environmental responsibility
- Collaborate effectively in diverse social, cultural, and global settings

IV. Personal and Career Development

- Identify and develop helpful resources and opportunities
- Demonstrate self-reflection and confidence
- Maintain or improve health
- Value lifelong learning

Whereas in June, 2012 in its Evaluation Team findings, ACCJC stated that "To fully meet Standard IV Leadership and Governance, the team recommends that college leaders from all constituencies evaluate and improve the college's governance structure and consequent processes used to inform decision making for the improvement of programs, practices and services and ensure that the process does not create undue barriers to the implementation of institutional decisions, plans and initiatives (IV.A.1, IV.A.3). (Accreditation Recommendation 13); and

Whereas, in August and September of 2012, the Academic Senate received training and recommendations from Michelle Pilati, President of the Academic Senate for California Community Colleges, and Scott Lay, President and CEO of the Community College League of California, to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of Academic Senate Committees; and

Whereas, on October 24th, 2013, the Academic Senate adopted Resolution 2012.10.24.03 including a plan and outcomes for restructuring Academic Senate Committees; and

Resolved, that the workgroup make recommendations to the Academic Senate Officers and Executive Council based on the survey and evaluation; and be it finally

Resolved, that the Academic Senate officers may, at their discretion, implement recommendations from the workgroup before the full evaluation is adopted by the Academic Senate Executive Council.

- **D.** Administrative Hiring Procedures and Position Announcements: President Saginor referenced Executive Council members' comments and suggested to the draft Administrative Hiring Procedures. Council members expressed uncertainty about whether the current Mutual Agreement between the Board of Trustees and the Academic Senate was, or was not, still in force. President Saginor indicated that, whatever procedures were eventually adopted, there are Ed Code provisions requiring that the Board rely primarily on the Academic Senate on questions regarding retreat rights and equivalency issues. A consensus was reached that clear hiring procedures need to be stated before the Senate could appoint faculty members to screening committees.
- **E.** Accreditation Show Cause Report: President Saginor presented a draft resolution authorizing her to sign the March 15, 2013 Show Cause Report to ACCJC. Council members discussed the importance of having an opportunity to discuss the finalized report before authorizing Saginor to sign. To allow for such discussion, this item will be put on the agenda of a special Executive Council meeting preceding the Spring Bipartite Meeting, February 20, 2013.
