As guests, we recognize that we benefit from living and working on their traditional homeland. We wish to pay our respects by acknowledging the ancestors, elders and relatives of the Ramaytush Community and by affirming their sovereign rights as First Peoples.

Chad is working with the librarians and looking for support to try to come up with something more substantial to share with the senate in an upcoming meeting.

 - No control or retainment; no limit to storage.
 - Rumor that accounts were sold on eBay. Being inappropriately used for private business; legal issues came up.

 - Mitra- language is too vague. Paper versions limits the access to public. Who will be moving all of the physical documents into one location.

 - Madeline Mueller: everything should be stored digitally. It's not either/or. It's both, where appropriate.
