

City College of San Francisco Self-Guided Tour **Ocean Campus**





- Here at the Ocean Campus' newest building, you will find many student services, including: Registration, Student Counseling, Financial Aid, and Admissions and Records (to name a few!)
- Take a walk down the first-floor hallway and look up to the eco-friendly skylights above
- 2. EXIT: the multi-use building south entrance, cross Frida Kahlo Way to: Conlan Hall and the Bookstore on your right
 - Conlan Hall hosts the Chancellor's office and the parking office (hint: save money on parking by purchasing a permit here!)
 - The Campus bookstore is where you'll get your textbooks, commencement regalia, CCSF merch...and the pencil you forgot to pack in your bag.
 - 3. CONTINUE: on your right, look down the amphitheater stairs, in the distance is the Wellness Center
 - The Wellness Center is a space for physical education, such as: swimming, weight lifting, dance, martial arts, basketball, and yoga.
 - 4. PROCEED: around Cloud Circle, to the Rosenberg Library



- The library is a great place for quiet study, as well as computer and printing access...and don't forget, the librarians are a resource too!
- The library is also home to the Learning Assistance Center, Umoja/African American Scholastic program, and The Collaboratory - a new space for all designers and makers!
- 5. KEEP COING along Cloud Circle, you'll pass the Football Field



down or

your right and reach **Batmale Hall**



straight ahead

- CCSF's football team is the most winning City College team in the U.S.!
- Batmale hall serves several departments, such as the Social Sciences, English, Criminology and Administrative Justice
- 6. AROUND THE BEND: Continue around Cloud Circle to the **Visual Arts** building and the **Creative Arts** building on your right



- These buildings are home to all things creative, such as: sculpting, painting, photography, drawing, and philosophy.
- Inside the Visual Arts building is Gallery Obscura, part of the photography department.
- 7. BEHIND: and next to the Creative Arts building and the Arts Extension is the Student Health Center
 - Here, students have access to physical and mental health services, provided by medical nurses. Visits to the clinic are free!
- 8. FINALLY: Cross Cloud Circle and walk up the many stairs to find yourself on the campus' highest peak between the **Science Hall** and **Cloud Hall**
 - The Science Hall hosts all things science, technology, and engineering. Originally, the Science Hall was the entire college, constructed in the 1930s.
 - Cloud Hall is home to a variety of departments and majors, as well as some valuable resources, such as the Queer Resource Center, the Latino Services Network, and the Filipino student success program.
