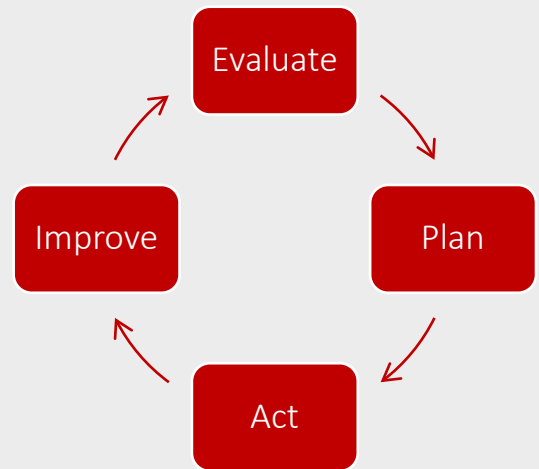
# PGC Evaluation Overview

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PGC evaluation has been an essential part our reflective process for continuous improvement

- Intent is to assure “effectiveness in supporting academic quality and accomplishment of mission” (Standard 1.B.7.)
- Recent emphasis has been on effectiveness of PGC Committees
  - Committee Objectives to foster and communicate focus
  - Evaluation survey to identify improvements areas
- Evaluation updates agendized annually by PGC to identify and/or track improvement plans and progress

# PGC Evaluation Survey 2022 - Results

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Top 3 priorities identified for training and associated discussions for PGC members and alternates:

1. Processes for making recommendations
2. Roles, Responsibilities, and Processes Handbook (RRP)
3. Relationship between the Council and its Committees

Importance to inform facilitation training for PGC Committee chairs and co-chairs (% rated "very important"):

- Ensure all constituency voices are heard (94%)
- Assure meetings have clear take-aways (88%)
- Promote engagement (85%)
- Eliminate overpowering / aggressive behaviors (79%)

# Flex Day Training Survey - Responses

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- Professional Development Committee Flex survey
- 10 respondents indicated they attended Participatory Governance Chair and Staff Training workshop (of total 25 attendees), including classified staff, faculty and department chairs, administrators
- "How likely are you to recommend this workshop to a colleague?"
  - 5.3 on scale of 1=lowest, 6=highest
- Additional considerations and next steps
  - Ideally all Committee chairs and co-chairs attend the training
  - Follow up next semester to assess implementation and improvement

# On a Related Note ...

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- In addition to evaluating PGC and its standing committees, we also concluded the evaluation of the Roles, Responsibilities, and Processes (RRP) Handbook in November 2022
- Sample changes resulting from the evaluation include:
  - Explicitly stating the areas for which classified staff should have the opportunity to provide input into decision making at the College
  - Adding an introduction to the D4 series of charts (Development of College Wide Initiatives, Board Policies, and Administrative Procedures) that clarifies the process leading up to PGC review, emphasizing the need for gathering and incorporating constituent input
