6.b. Alternate title: Recommendation to change the grading policy for all local GE courses

Whereas Title V requires an overall GPA of 2.0 or better, grades of “C” or “P” or better for “major” courses, and a grade of “D” or better for General Education (GE) courses and

Whereas, the Cal-GETC pattern requires a “C” or “P” or better for all GE courses and

Whereas, the local (CCSF) requirement is an overall GPA of 2.0 or better, grades of “C” or “P” or better for “major” courses, grades of “D” or better for GE courses except for “C” or better in English Composition and Math, be it therefore

Resolved, the CCSF Academic Senate accepts the Ed Policies Committee recommendation to change local policy to require a grade of “C” or better in all GE courses.

6.c. Report from Non Credit Adult Ed Committee

Resolved, the Academic Senate Executive Council encourages the Noncredit Adult Education Committee to review the West Ed findings and create an action proposal for consideration by the Executive Council.

8.a. Resolution temporarily suspending Program Review Committee and assigning responsibilities to Executive Council

Whereas CCSF requested guidance through the Institutional Effectiveness Partnership Initiative (IEPI) and the Partnership Resource Team (PRT) issued a strong recommendation to analyze scheduling and programming practices, resulting in the divergence from the regular Comprehensive Program Review (CPR) process and the adoption of the two-year process known as CPR1 and CPR 2; and

Whereas the Academic Senate Executive Council (ASEC) voted to endorse this two year comprehensive program review process ([2025.05.21.6.a](#)) and

Whereas Faculty maintain purview over the whole body of curriculum and programming as outlined in these parts of the 10+1:

1. (1) Curriculum including establishing prerequisites and placing courses within disciplines
2. (2) Degree and certificate requirements
3. (4) Educational program development
4. (5) Standards or policies regarding student preparation and success
5. (9) Processes for program review

and,

Whereas the ASEC is the official elected representative of the whole faculty body, and

Whereas this exceptional two-year CPR process requires the attention and engagement of the whole Faculty body be it therefore

Resolved, that ASEC express gratitude to the Program Review Committee for their outstanding work developing guiding documents, facilitating reading circles, and engaging faculty in the work of the 2022 CPR process, and

Resolved, that ASEC hereby temporarily suspend the Program Review Committee, and

Resolved that ASEC assume the responsibilities previously assigned to the Program Review Committee, and invite all current members of the committee to attend and participate in all discussions on this subject.

8.b. Resolution calling for the publication of Action Plans submitted as part of CPR1

Whereas, Action Plans are to be submitted in late 2025 or early 2026 in lieu of the normal Comprehensive Program Review (CPR) submission through CurricUnet, and

Whereas, all regular CPR reports are available to the College community via CurricUnet and it is important to maintain the transparency and visibility of all parts of the CPR process, be it therefore

Resolved that the Academic Senate recommends that CPR1/CPR2 Action Plans be made public to the entire College community after their submission and initial Dean review.
